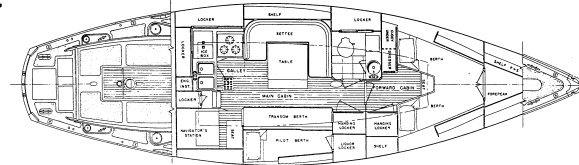

ACCOMMODATIONS

Ariane sleeps six in two cabins. She has the dinette layout with separate nav station. There is a v-berth forward with filler, while in the main salon there are one transom and one pilot berth to starboard, and a dinette to port that converts to a double bed. A separate nav station with bookshelf is starboard, aft. The head is equipped with a shower and hot and cold pressurized water. The galley has a three-burner propane stove with oven, and a state of the art Frigoboat refrigeration system.

ELECTRONICS

Raymarine C120 radar/chartplotter, Garmin GPS color plotter, VHF radio, Raytheon autopilot with fluxgate compass and remote control, B&G cockpit instruments (wind, depth, speed), Pains-Wessex EPIRB, Tivoli CD sound system, inverter that provides 110V power either alongside or underway, 12V convenience plug.

ADDITIONAL EQUIPMENT

Harken roller furler, dodger, Bariant winches, Ideal anchor windlass with three anchors and rodes, cockpit cushions, cockpit table and drink holder, boarding ladder, holding tank with Tankwatch system, cabin fans, screens, gas BBQ grill, rowing dinghy with Honda outboard. Mid-boom sheeting provides an unobstructed cockpit.

COMPLETE WITH

Linen (two sheets, one pillow case, two towels and a face cloth for each member of your party plus a dish towel and potholder), operating instructions, charts (complete Maine Coast), boating almanac, tide table, cruising guide, basic safety equipment, eating & cooking utensils, blankets & pillows, basic mechanical & navigational tools, fuel, water, and ice.

YOU BRING

Binoculars, foul weather gear (with hopes that you won't need it), warm clothes for sailing, tee shirts and shorts for sitting at anchor and exploring islands.
