### ACCOMMODATIONS

*Sweetwater* has berths for seven in two cabins. There is a custom 7-foot v-berth and filler forward with a private entrance to the head, two pilot berths and two transom berths in the main saloon with "Pullman-style" privacy curtains for the transom berths, and one quarter berth aft. The galley is equipped with a large single sink with hot and cold pressurized water, Grunert refrigeration and a three-burner shipmate stove with oven. Opposite the galley is a spacious navigation station. There is one head with shower and an Espar heater aboard.

### ELECTRONICS

Ray Marine E-series (3-D view): E-120 radar/chartplotter/Sirius WX at navigation station and E-80 radar/chartplotter/Sirius WX at the helm; Raytheon WAAS Raystar 120 GPS; AIS system; Raytheon speed, depth, wind ST60 instruments with repeater at nav station; Raytheon ST6000 auto pilot; Icom 502 VHF/DSC with cockpit mounted microphone, Hailer with fog and anchor signals; Sony stereo with FM and tape player.

### ADDITIONAL EQUIPMENT

Hood Sea Furl II Main Stoway, Harken II Seafurl roller furler, new standing rigging (2010), Barient self-tailing winches (two electric), Ideal electric windlass, cockpit dodger, cockpit table, gas BBQ grill, and Avon RIB with 8 h.p. outboard.

Linen (two sheets, one pillow case, two towels and a face cloth for each member of your party plus a dish towel and potholder), operating instructions, charts (complete Maine Coast), boating almanac, tide table, cruising guide, basic safety equipment, eating & cooking utensils, blankets & pillows, basic mechanical & navigational tools, fuel, water, and ice.

Binoculars, foul weather (gear with hopes that you won't need it), warm clothes for sailing, t-shirts and shorts for sitting at anchor and exploring islands.
