ACCOMMODATIONS

Caroline has a small double berth and a single berth in the owner's aft stateroom along with a full head and shower. In the main saloon, she has a curved settee to starboard, a fixed dining table, a settee to port, a full galley with Grunert refrigeration, a three-burner propane stove with oven, and a full helm. There is a v-berth in the forward guest cabin with a private head. An additional freezer chest is located on the aft deck. Loads of storage space is found throughout the boat.

ELECTRONICS

Raytheon RL70 Charter Plotter and fishfinder, remote controlled searchlight, and a hand-held spotlight at upper helm. Raytheon RL 70 color radar and Standard Horizon color charter plotter at lower helm. Raytheon 650 Auto Pilot, depthsounder, VHF, and Intercom at both helms. TV (2009), phone inlet, dual air-conditioning units, & a Kenwood AM/FM with cassette player.

ADDITIONAL EQUIPMENT

Flybridge and cockpit binnies; aft cabin dodger with screens; shore power; swim platform and ladder; hot/cold shower located at stern; Ideal electric windlass; gas BBQ grill; cabin oil lights; flush mounted headlights in bow; electric hailer; weather clothes at upper helm; cage around prop; and an Avon RIB inflatable with 15 hp Mercury outboard.

COMPLETE WITH

Linen (two sheets, one pillow case, two towels and a face cloth for each member of your party plus a dish towel and potholder), operating instructions, charts (complete Maine Coast), boating almanac, tide table, cruising guide, basic safety equipment, eating & cooking utensils, blankets & pillows, basic mechanical & navigational tools, fuel, water, and ice.

YOU BRING

Binoculars, foul weather gear with hopes that you won't need it, warm clothes for sailing, tee shirts and shorts for sitting at anchor and exploring islands.

We will have the boat fueled upon your arrival and will charge you for the amount of fuel you used upon your return based on the tachometer time.
