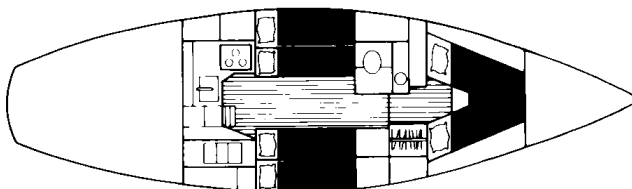


Eagle Wing

ACCOMMODATIONS

Eagle Wing sleeps six in two cabins. There is one head with a shower and hot & cold pressurized water. The galley is equipped with an icebox and a three-burner propane stove with oven. There is a beautifully refurbished cast iron stove to help keep you warm on cool evenings.

Raytheon 10X radar, Raytheon GPS, Icom VHF, Datamarine knotmeter, fathometer & WSI, AM/FM radio and CD player (2001).

ADDITIONAL EQUIPMENT

Harken roller furling for headsail (2000), Barient ST primary winches, dodger (2003), screens, boarding ladder, BBQ grill, shore power and rowing dinghy.

COMPLETE WITH

Linen (two sheets, one pillow case, two towels and a face cloth for each member of your party plus a dish towel and potholder), operating instructions, charts (complete Maine Coast), boating almanac, tide table, cruising guide, basic safety equipment, eating & cooking utensils, blankets & pillows, basic mechanical & navigational tools, fuel, water, and ice.

YOU BRING

Binoculars, foul weather gear (with hopes that you won't need it), warm clothes for sailing, t-shirts and shorts for sitting at anchor and exploring islands.
